When 4-H members are asked why they stay in the program they explained that 4-H provided them a place where they could be themselves.

They felt free to choose what they wanted to do. They could select projects they wanted to learn about, activities they wanted to participate in and programs they wanted to attend. They felt 4-H offered them opportunities they would not have anywhere else. They liked to learn about projects through hands-on experiences; they liked attending camp and performing on a stage; they enjoyed leading a group, working with adults and helping younger youth. They liked interacting with youth of different ages.

The members also emphasized how much it meant to learn in a environment where competition and non-competitive experiences were carefully mixed together. They felt 4-H helped them meet youth from other communities, states and nations.
