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LIBERTY

General: Liberty is demonstrating the natural beauty of the pony/horse. Ponies/Horses are to be judged on style, grace, animation, gaits, presence, and ease of catching. The liberty animal is expected to perform at both a walk trot and canter.

Use of the entire ring is expected

Ponies/Horses will be judged beginning when the halter is removed by the exhibitor (the individual wearing the number) and until caught and haltered by the exhibitor. Time of liberty shall be $\underline{11/2}$ minutes; time to catch shall be $\underline{1}$ $\underline{1/2}$ minutes.

HALTER

This is to show the judge your horse's conformation, obedience and way of moving. It is intended to judge how suitable the horse is for breeding stock. However, today all breeds, geldings, mares, and stallions can be shown.

However, all classes require that horses be meticulously groomed before entering the ring, be trained to stand correctly in the style dictated by their breed or discipline, and to walk and trot on command in a designated pattern or line.

Driving All Around

The purpose of this class is to promote the versatility of the 4-H horse that is being driven. This is <u>NOT</u> strictly a reinsmanship, pleasure or halter class but a combination that will showcase the horse that is trail driven, show pen driven, or used as a family or lesson equine. This class is not breed specific but is <u>DRIVING</u> specific. No registration papers are required for this class. Judged 40% reinsmanship, 40% for pleasure driving and 20% on halter confirmation.



In Hand All Around

The purpose of this class is to promote the versatility of the 4-H horse that is being shown or handled in hand. This is <u>NOT</u> strictly a suitability, obstacle or halter class but a combination that will showcase the small equine and their versality for all. This class is <u>Small Equine</u> specific. No registration papers are required for this class. Judged 40% for suitability with the handler, 40% for obstacle or trail work and 20% on halter confirmation.





Driving Pleasure

The pleasure driving horse should have basically the same general qualities as the pleasure saddle horse. Special emphasis is placed on the flat-footed walk and the pleasurability of the ride for the driver. The horse should be in balance with a head and neck carriage typical of its breed or type, should be light-mouthed, and have a free way of moving. At all gaits, it must work in form (i.e., head held quietly, mouth closed, and legs working beneath itself). The traces should be steady at all times, demonstrating consistency of forward motion and that the horse is pulling from the traces, not from the mouth or saddle. Hunter Over Fences

The hunter should provide his rider with a safe, consistent ride at a working pace over a course of fences similar to those that might be encountered in the field. This requires that all horses must be serviceably sound and any horse showing evidence of lameness, broken wind or impairment of vision will be refused an award and will be excused from the ring by the steward, show veterinarian, or judge.

Each horse will individually negotiate a course consisting of at least 8 jumps over a minimum of 4 different obstacles. At least one change of direction is recommended. The course must meet the approval of the judge.

GAMBLER'S CHOICE –

- Each driver has the same amount of time in which to negotiate as many obstacles as possible. Each obstacle is assigned a point value according to its degree of difficulty, the easier obstacles having a lesser value than the more difficult obstacles and each driver tries to obtain as high a point score as possible in the time allowed.
 - a. Obstacles may be driven in any order.
 - b. Each obstacle can be attempted twice and may be approached from either direction.
 - c. Drivers must attempt a different obstacle before returning to that obstacle for a second try.
 - d. Once an obstacle has been disrupted, it can no longer be attempted.
- 2. If all obstacles are completed twice before the twominute time limit, the driver will exit through the finish line for the final point and time scoring.

EQUITATION

PLEASURE DRIVING

The pleasure driving horse should have basically the same general qualities as the pleasure saddle horse. Special emphasis is placed on the flat-footed walk and the pleasurability of the ride for the driver. The horse should be in balance with a head and neck carriage typical of its breed or type, should be light-mouthed, and have a free way of moving. At all gaits, it must work in form (i.e., head held quietly, mouth closed, and legs working beneath itself). The traces should be steady at all times, demonstrating consistency of forward motion and that the horse is pulling from the traces, not from the mouth or saddle. Erratic movements are highly undesirable. Hesitation or breaking stride will be penalized.
